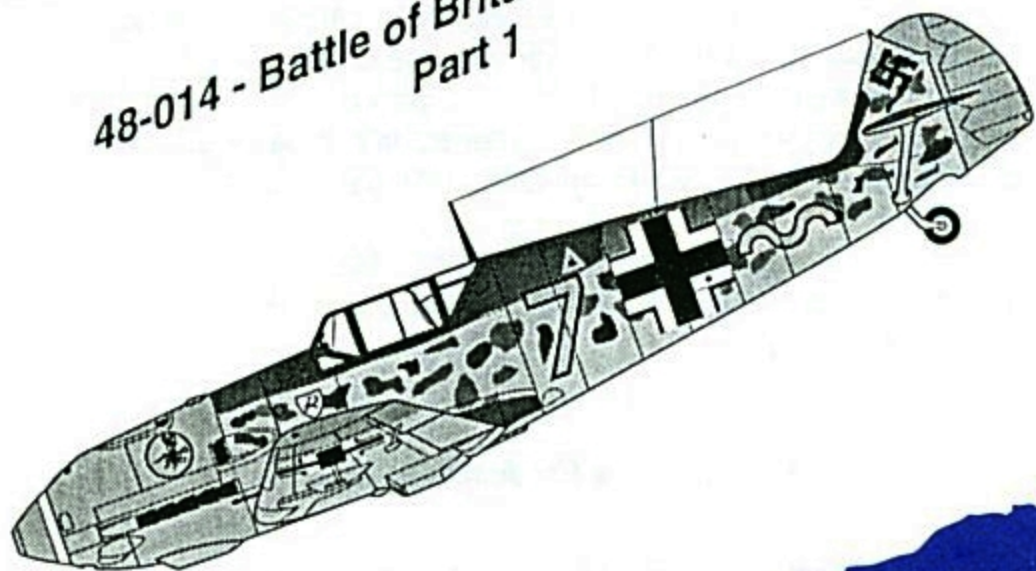

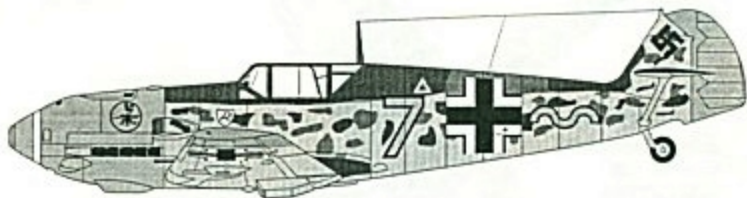

Bf-109E-4, 9/JG.2 "Richthofen", Beaumont-le-Roger, France, September 1940. Flown by Ofw. Rudolf Rothenfelder. RLM 71/02/65 camouflage with fuselage mottle of 02 & 70. Nose, rudder and upper and lower wingtips yellow 04. Spinner yellow with white ring.



Bf-109E-4/B, W.Nr. 5901, 8/JG.53, flown by Oblt. Walter Fiel. Crashed near Tonbridge, Kent on 2 October 1940. RLM 70/71/65 camouflage with 02 mottling of varying density on fuselage sides. Nose and rudder yellow 04. Spinner yellow with white tip and black & white halved base. Cowl ring red.

Bf-109E-4, W.Nr. 15188, Stab./JG.1, Flown by Oblt Reinhart Heydrich from Wangerooze, Holland, summer 1940. Camouflaged in RLM 70/71/65 with spinner quartered in green (possibly RLM 25) and white.



Bf-109E-4, 9/JG.2 "Richthofen", Le Havre, France, summer 1940. RLM 71/02/65 camouflage with 70/02 mottling on fuselage sides and vertical tail surfaces. Nose and spinner white, rudder trim tab red.

Bf-109E-3, W.Nr. 1325, flown by Fw. Walter Schulz of 3/JG.53. Crashed near Langney, Sussex, 30 September 1940. RLM 70/71/65 with 71 carried down fuselage sides. Nose, vertical stabilizer, rudder, upper and lower wing and stabilizer tips yellow 04. Vertical tail surfaces edged in RLM 71. Spinner black or RLM 70 with yellow tip. Trim tab red.
