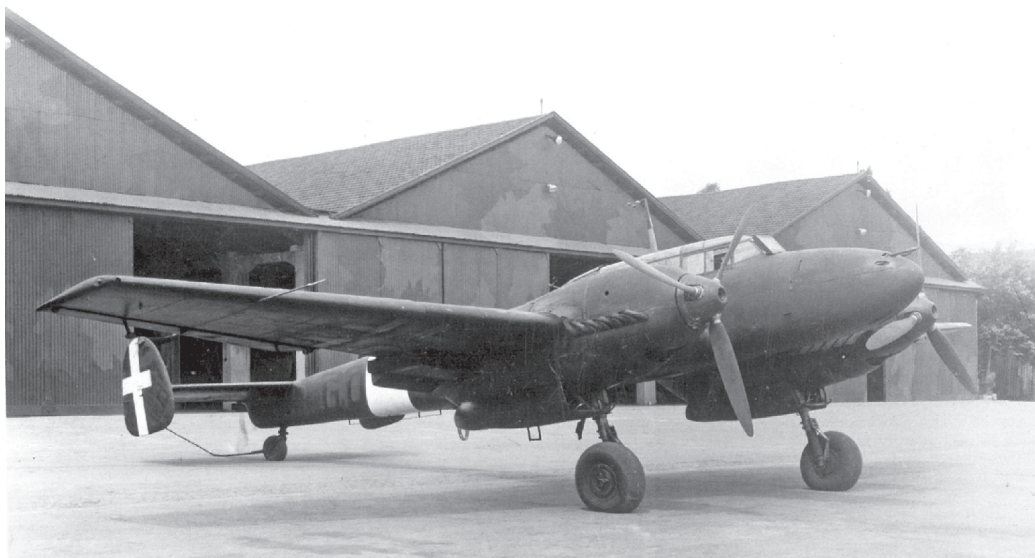

Plane 235-5 (colour photo) had standard German day camouflage (RLM 70/71) with the under surface painted black (RLM 22) for night operations. On the fuselage and on the rudders were traces of cancellation of the previous *Luftwaffe* marking - probably with Italian paints. On the wings and therefore probably also under, despite of the presence of Italian codes, the German crosses are still applied.

Plane 235-6 had standard black overall camouflage only exception are white insignia and the unit code in grey blue. The cancellations of the German codes and insignia, had been made with black paint.

Painting of the plane 235-7 is total reconstruction made by Marco Gueli (there are not available photos) taking as a reference the night camouflage and low visibility insignia adopted from Reggiane Re 2001sCN of the 234th Sq.



Two images of the same Bf 110, taken at Guidonia in summer 1942, immediately after the Italian insignia were painted on. On the fuselage sides the German codes are still visible.
