

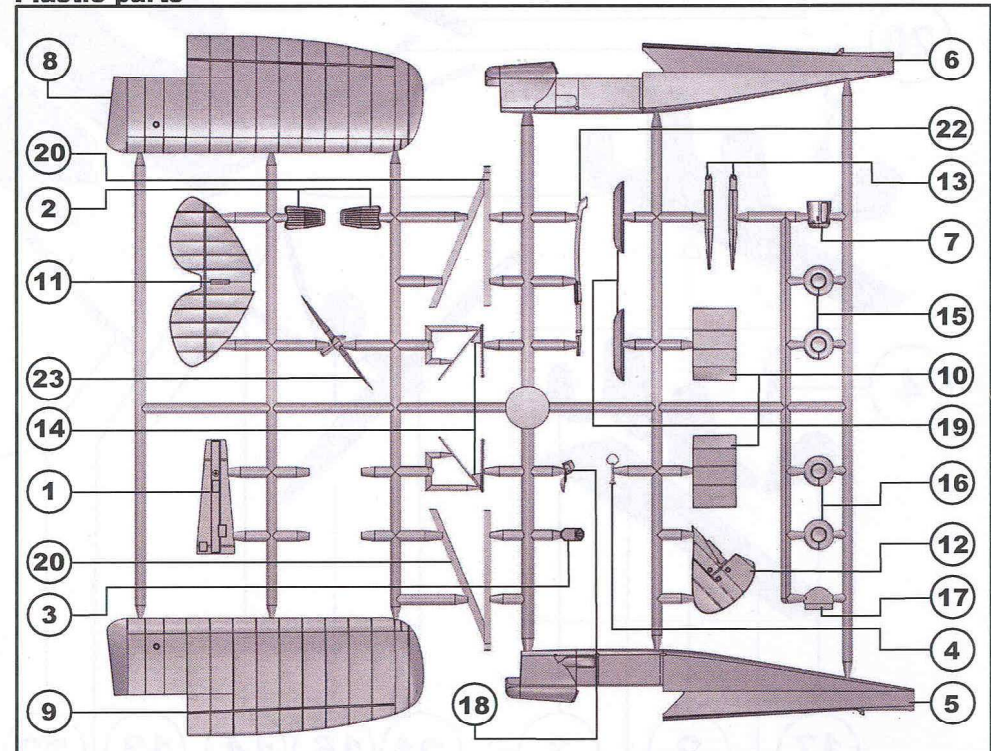

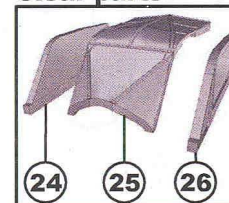
**AVI MODELS**

Study drawings and practise assembly before cementing parts together. Paint small parts before assembly. To apply decals cut sheet as required, dip in warm water for a few seconds, slide off backing into position shown. Use in conjunction with box artwork. This model is executed on short run technology and is intended only for experienced modelers. Not appropriate for children under 36 months of age, due to the presence of small detachable parts.

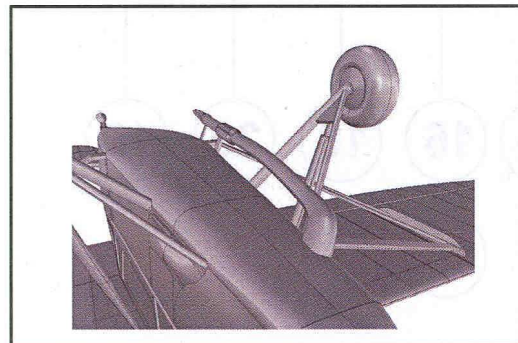
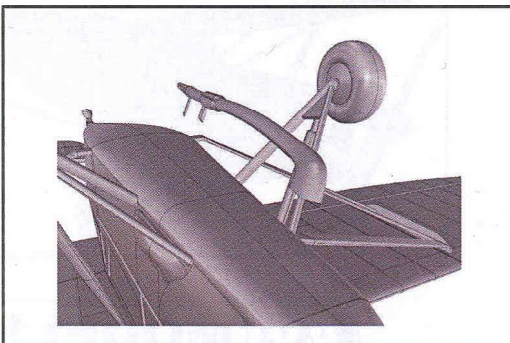
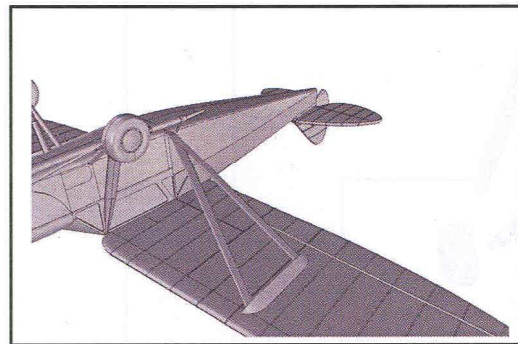
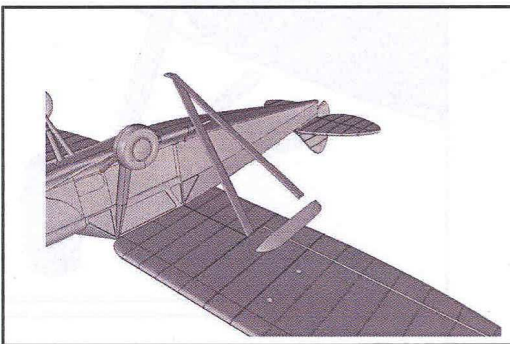
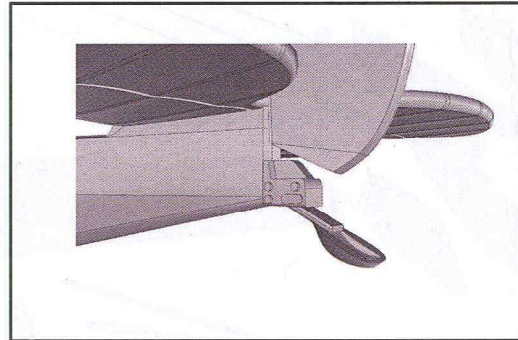
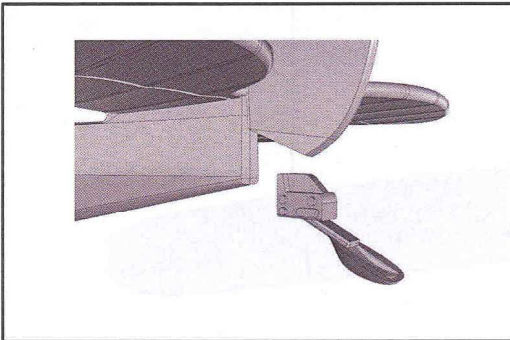
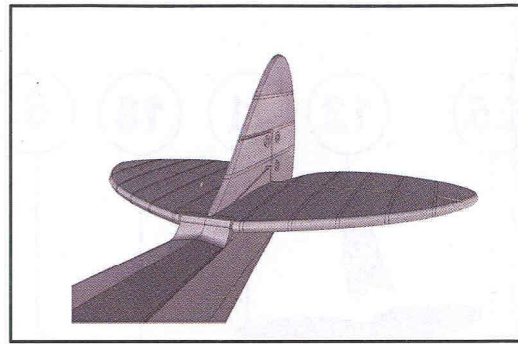
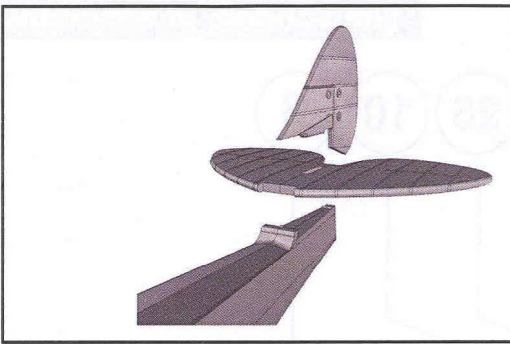

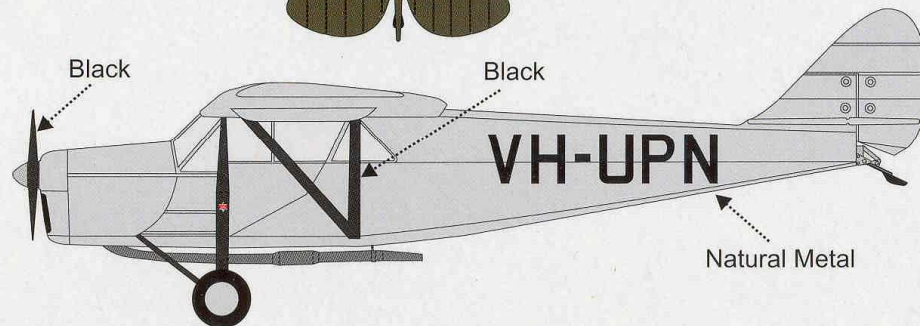
DH.80A of Royal Canadian Air Force, de Havilland factory at Downsview, Toronto, 1931.



DH.80A, c/n 2044, supplied to Air Ministry as K1824. This aircraft was purchased for trials by RAF as de luxe high-speed communications aircraft, 1930.

DH.80A, c/n 2023, "VH-UPN" in ownership by C. Arthur Butler. The inscription "AIR MAIL" reflects on a successful tender for a scheduled airmail service on the Cootamundra-Charleville sector of the new Empire Air Mail. Butler operated this route with his company Butler Air Transport during 1934 with DH.84. This aircraft was destroyed by Japanese air attack on Darwin aerodrome in February 1942.
