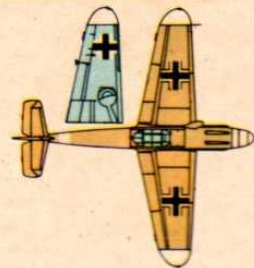

MESSERSCHMITT Bf 109F

MESSERSCHMITT Bf 109F single seat fighter 1:72 scale

The Messerschmitt 109 series single seat fighters were one of the mainstays of the Luftwaffe throughout World War 2. The original design of Willy Messerschmitt was prepared in 1935 and the planes were built by the Bayerische Flugzeugwerke (Bf). The prototype of the F version, which differed from the preceding E series by having rounded wingtips, first flew in July 1940. The F entered service in early 1941 and were extensively used in France, the Mediterranean and on the Russian front. Their performance closely matched the British Spitfire against which they fought constantly. Engine: 1,800 h.p. Daimler-Benz DB 601N or E. Max. Speed: 366 m.p.h. at 19,700 ft. Service ceiling: 37,700 ft. Armament: two MG 17 guns, one MG/FF 20 mm gun.

To complete the aircraft as illustrated, you will need model aircraft paint. A display stand is not supplied with this model.

10 MODEL TIPS

If you desire to paint, use appropriate model aircraft paints, taking as a guide either of the two illustrations, which are to be found under the front blister. Use the illustrations for correct selection and positioning of the transfers.

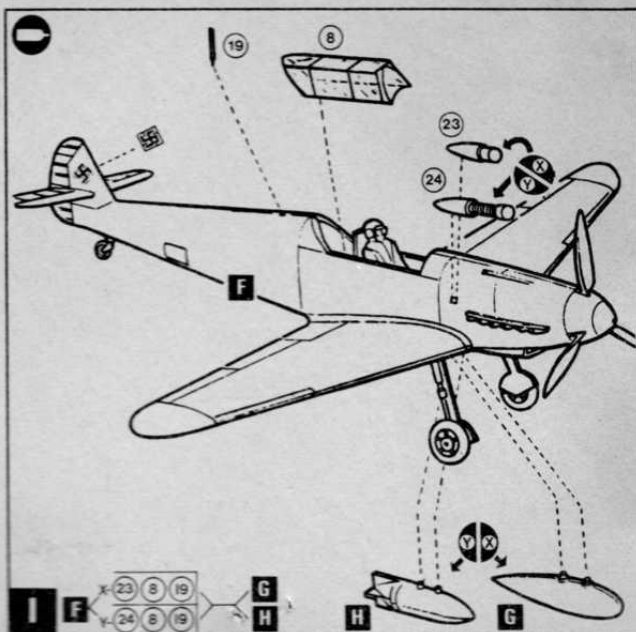
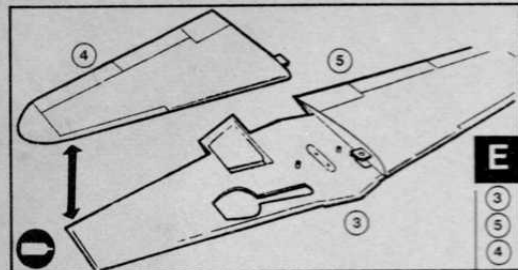
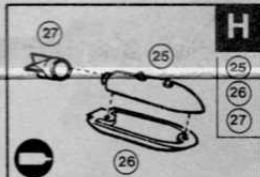
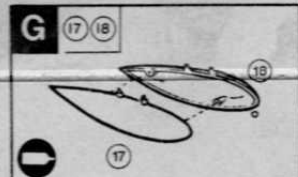
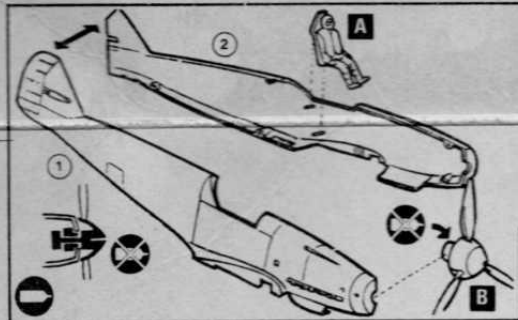
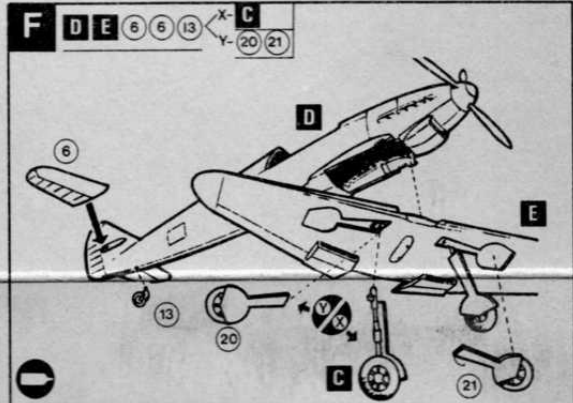
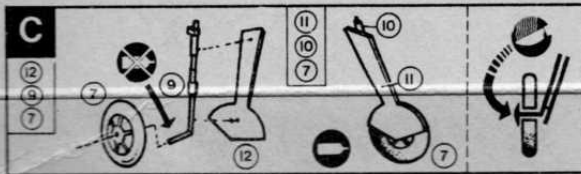
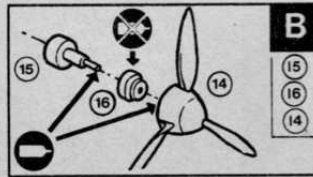
Caution

Polystyrene cement is highly inflammable. Keep away from naked flame, and also from the face - particularly the eyes and nose - and from clothing. Use pin to open tube and replace after use. Use sparingly.



Instructions Test assembly position and fit of parts before cementing. Assemble in sequence shown i.e. A, B, C, D, etc. Note that the part numbers needed for each step are listed in the recommended assembly sequence.

Special Instructions When making a model with undercarriage retracted omit assembly step C of instructions and use parts 20 and 21. Part 24 is a tropicalised dust filter, to be used only if making the JG 27 version as illustrated.
